1). GDP Amendment- Expansion of the Tennis Facility and Addition/Relocation of the Batting Cages.

- Jeff Greenwald Presents
- Continuation of presentation in March, but with a few small changes
- RPTC has 350 people and a 3-year waitlist

- The conceptual plan is to add amenities to accommodate the demand.
- The conceptual plan was presented in January and received approval in March to proceed.
- 44ft by 100 ft courts with a 7-foot fence.
- Plans to make precautions with nets to prevent foul balls from hitting people.
- Plans to make a clubhouse and temporary structure for office.
- Plans to add 4 batting lanes per cage, far away from camp area.
- Plans for the Transportation and Storm Water Department to make a connection from club house to office.
