# Notes from the Community Planners Committee - November 29, 2022 via Vicki Touchstone

The November meeting included:

**Agenda Item 1** - MOVE TO IN PERSON MEETINGS: Discussion regarding whether to move to in person meetings. There was support for various options, and much discussion regarding making the meetings accessible for all. The CPC ultimately approved a motion stating: "The CPC requests that the City look into the capabilities for CPC to hold hybrid meetings; lacking such capabilities, the CPC requests to be allowed to continue to hold online meetings as well as allowing the option for online meeting software/hybrid/in person meetings for each CPG and their subcommittees." The CPC also approved a motion to ask the State to amend the Brown Act to include online meeting software as options for meetings.

**Agenda Item 2** - REQUEST TO MAINTAIN FEE FREE APPEALS: The recent Community Planning Group reforms have eliminated fee free appeals by Planning Groups. The CPC discussed whether to pursue reinstating this practice. This discussion was continued from the October CPC meeting. The discussion ranged from requesting that the decision be reversed to allowing one or more fee opportunities. After much discussion, the CPC voted to request that the City Council provide each PG with the ability to appeal one project throughout the appeals process without fee per calendar year.
