
#### Why Social Equity?

- Why is Social Equity important?
- ▶ 50 year anniversary of MLK demise, yet just about every single social indicator looks as if there is not much progress.
- Although equity is obviously an important concept and a democratic concept...
- it is not an easy concept to implement simply by introducing behavioral prescriptions, rules, and/or simply completing a checklist.
- Instead, it requires a commitment to understanding an entire new worldview that may be at odds with the status quo and then having the courage to make policies that reflect this new perspective.





### Equality




The assumption is that everyone benefits from the same support. Equal treatment. Equal opportunity.

### Equity



Everyone gets the support they need. Outcome based.

#### Reality



Engaging in equality, often times, exacerbates, rather than ameliorating the existing inequities. Widens the gap. Allows those who can already see with benefits that they may not need, while continuing to block access those who cannot see.






### What is the Source of this inequality/inequity?

### Humanitarianism: False Generosity

- ▶ "As a society, we are happy to help and serve the poor, as long as we don't have to walk with them where they walk, that is, as long as we can minister to them from our safe enclosures. The poor can then remain passive objects of our actions, rather than friends, compañeros and compañeras with whom we interact. As long as we can be sure that we will not have to live with them, and thus have interpersonal relationships with them... we will try to help 'the poor'—but, again, only from a controllable, geographical distance."




### How do we get "to the promise land?"

- Some things to think about...
- Must be honest and clear about our own situation or reality (Evaluate)
- Must not represent/support reality for it reproduces the same and leads to tinkering (reproduction of inequities). The Band-Aid approach. (Analyze)
- Instead must (re) present possibilities (transformation toward equity) (Act).
- Focus is "Park and Recreation" but should be placed in the larger framework of "building a healthy, safe, vibrant, and dignified community for ALL"



### Dignity as Policy: Replacing Individualistic 13 Worldviews with Worldviews of Connectedness

- In Lak'ech Ala k'in (You are my other me. Mayan)
- Mitakuye Oyasin (All my relations—sacredness of all, including animals, mountains, rivers, plants, earth. Nothing exists in isolation. Lakota Sioux)
- Namaste (I bow to the divine in you. East India/Nepal)
- ▶ Buber's Dazwischen (the "in-between" where all things exist).
- Seeing Jesus in the other (Liberation Theology/Latin America).
- Tu Eres Mi Otro Yo (Luis Valdez)
- Yin and Yang (Taoism/Not opposites; rather complimentary)
- No justification for "not caring" for ALL of our brothers and sisters who are ALL of our community members.



#### Equity is not a foreign concept!

- We engage in equity ALL the time.
- Examples of children needs: we act in equitable manner with respect to time, money, food, and other resources on a daily basis.
- Barry University
- Participatory Budgeting
- All based on the idea of real family, real connectedness. When this is the assumption, equity makes perfect sense.





### Park and Recreation Members as "Agents of Change"

- "You are the Social Change that you've been waiting for!" --Attributed often to Mahatma Gandhi--
- This idea does several important things to transform ourselves:
  - ▶ 1. It forces us to self reflect and not judge others
  - ▶ 2. It requires us to take action affirmatively
