## “Retired Senior Volunteer Patrol”

In 1992, the San Diego Police Department developed a partnership with retired citizens from our communities.

Over the years, the RSVP program has grown to almost 300 volunteers. These local citizens provide additional visibility in our neighborhoods, contributing to the reduction of crime in San Diego.

Our RSVP program has been recognized nationwide as a successful example of law enforcement and communities working together to improve the quality of life for all citizens.

The focus of this program is to extend community based services throughout the City of San Diego and to assist police officers.



### WHO ARE YOUR RSVP VOLUNTEERS?

The RSVP's are uniformed volunteers who supplement the police department by performing many important non-confrontational duties as well as providing an extra set of “eyes and ears” for the department who also are considered as “Ambassadors of Good Will” while patrolling their defined areas.

### QUALIFICATIONS

- 50 years or older
- Semi or fully retired
- Valid California driver's license
- Available for patrol a minimum of 3 days a month
- All new volunteers are required to spend 4 days in training at the police academy for instruction of procedures and policies.
- Pass a background check
- Have no felony convictions

### RSVP DUTIES MAY INCLUDE:

- “Vacation House” security checks.
- “YANA” You Are Not Alone checks.
- Patrolling local schools.
- Patrolling religious facilities.
- Marking abandoned vehicles.
- Disabled parking enforcement.
- Participating in community events.
- Conducting business security surveys.
- Traffic Control.
- Assisting detectives and ....many other duties.
