- 5,200-square-foot building
  - Size is inadequate for the growing community


## The New Branch Library Features

  - Technical Approach and Design Concept
  - Technical Presentation (Interview)
  - Design Competition/Community Vote
  - Equal Employment and Contracting Opportunity



# **Evaluation Criteria**


- Evaluations are based on a 100-point system including:
- Summary of Proposal (5 points max.)
- Project Team (5 points max.)
- Technical Approach and Design Concept (15 points max.)
- Construction Plan (15 points max.)
- Equal Employment and Contracting Opportunity (25 points max.)
- Community Votes (25 points max.)
- Technical Presentation (10 points max.)





# **Community Vote**

- Community Workshop-Lead by City Staff
- Community provides input on building and facility features
- Shortlisted teams take notes and implement community input in their conceptual design
- Submittals are then displayed on the project webpage and if allowed at the public library for community to view and cast a vote
- Votes are sorted by zip codes to include those within the established vicinity area



The scoring is based on a weighted average (Votes received/total overall votes) x 25 = Points Earned



#### Equal Employment and Contracting Opportunity

- The overall objective of the City's Equal Employment Opportunity Program is to ensure that contractors doing business with or receiving funds from the City will not engage in unlawful discriminatory employment practices prohibited by State or Federal Law
- San Diego Municipal Code Sections 22.2701 through 22.2708 describe the overall requirements
- The larger the participation the closer to the EOC max points
