
Dear Mr. Davis:

Under SERA an attractive new clubhouse has been completed at the bowling greens in the Park. There is one thing left that is highly necessary, and that is a power mower, which will cost about \$300.00. Bowling is a very popular sport, there being 15 clubs in Southern California now, and every city in Canada has dozens of bowling clubs. With our Exposition, we are looking to bringing Canadians to San Diego, but the greens need to be cut three times a week and very closely, developing a turf similar to a golf green. This is impossible by hand and at the present time our greens are the poorest in Southern California.

I therefore respectfully ask that you bring the matter to the attention of the proper authorities in order that this very necessary machine may be secured. Mr. Morley says that his budget will not stand it, but you will realize that tourists and visitors are our principal asset, and with real bowling greens we can bring many visitors and new residents to San Diego.
