Introduce new VISTAs and new Partners

Review Working Group Meeting #3 (June 2017)

In this meeting the group focused on identifying and shaping indicators that will support working group goals and sub goals. The brainstorming and authentic community input will continue to be used by working groups in the planning and implementation activities.

Again asking the question of "How can this data be collected?" as the partners move forward in efforts to work together and focus on the practicality of the indicators.

Review Safety Indicators

Noted that Indicators need to be realistic and attainable but also condensed and manageable.

Goal 3:

3. Number of rate of Part I Crimes (GREEN)

Clarification came from SDPD that Part I Crimes are Violent Crimes which include: Murder, rape, robbery, simple assault. The data source is SDPD and the group would like to track crimes in the parks.

3. Number of rate of Part II Crimes (GREEN)

Clarification by SDPD Part II Crimes are Non-Violent Crimes that include: auto theft, car prowls, commercial burglary, residential burglary, shoplift, theft. The data source is SDPD and the group would like to track crimes in the parks.

3. Recidivism in the Promise Zone (WHITE)

Data source is Probation

3a. Community Perception of Safety (WHITE) - Moved to PINK Indicator

The group wants to know the use of park and recreation center. Perhaps monthly advisory groups may be the data source.

3a. Use of Park and Rec (WHITE)

Smart City Streetlights?

3b; 2b. Improved Infrastructure (miles of sidewalks, bike ability, pocket parks, rec centers) (GREEN) CIP and possibly Salesforce Survey

3b; 6. Internet Access cross-cutting indicator. To define what is meant. Ensure activities align (Pink) NextDoor? Get it Done app?

- Green what we think we can do now
- Yellow we think we know where its coming from, we just have to dig a little deeper to get it
- Pink cross-team communication across work groups. We know we need to track these, but don't quite know how yet
- White may want to track later, but not pressing, or not sure how to gather data currently

Measuring San Diego Promise Zone Results

In this meeting indicators were more specifically looked at and overviewed for the sole purpose of asking if they will ultimately be helpful in tracking progress.

Community Perceptions of Safety- The group discussed a possible correlation between perception of safety and use of the parks and rec.

Internet Access- The use of apps was evaluated further, specifically the Next Door and Get it Done apps.

The group discussed the pros and cons of Internet Access determining that these things are good but the question remains of how accessible internet really is in the Promise Zone.

Next Meeting

Moving forward the group feels more confident in the recent changes made on the indicators. They understand that community involvement is very important and will keep that in mind as they develop a plan. At the August meeting, the group will finalize the indicators and continue work on the logic model for the next steps and activities that will help us towards our goals.
