SAN DIEGO BIDS FAREWELL TO LONG-TIME COMMUNITY CHAMPION *Councilmember Chris Cate declares day in Christine Moore's honor*

San Diego, CA – After more than a decade serving as Director of External Affairs for AT&T, responsible for legislative and regulatory issues and community affairs for the South San Diego and Imperial Counties region, Christine Moore will be relocating to Visalia to rejoin her husband, Jason.

"I have known Christine Moore for 11 years. From allocating charitable gifts for non-profits to providing leadership advice to high school students, Christine has made thousands of San Diegans' lives better from the bay to the desert. San Diego's loss is Visalia's gain," stated Councilmember Chris Cate.

Christine's civic engagement has been steadfast and unwavering, having served twice as Chair of the City of Chula Vista's Cultural Arts Commission, and in other leadership roles, such as First Vice President on the Board of Directors of the Urban Corps of San Diego County, President for the Third Avenue Village Association, and Chair of the Board of Directors for the South County Economic Development Council.

Christine has also served on the Board of Directors for the San Diego Foundation, National Conflict Resolution Center, the Imperial Valley Community Foundation, the R.J. Donovan Citizens Advisory Committee, the Kaiser Permanente Patient and Family Care Council, and the Chula Vista and East County Chambers of Commerce, where she was awarded "Businesswoman of the Year" in 2012. She was a founding member of the Fairmount Park Neighborhood Association, and has served as a member of the Small Business Advisory Committee of the Greater San Diego County Chamber of Commerce, and the Tidelands Activation Program Committee of the Port of San Diego.

Prior to joining AT&T, Christine served as the Deputy District Director for California State Senator and State Budget Chair Denise Moreno Ducheny, Council Representative to San Diego City Council President Scott Peters, and Legislative Aide to County Supervisor Ron Roberts, after co-owning a successful small business in City Heights for nearly a decade.

"I am so honored to be recognized by our elected leaders in the city where I was born and raised. My efforts over the years to give back to my community are my way of saying 'thank you' to a region that has given me and my family so much," said Christine Moore.
