A reasonable modification is a structural change made to the premises while a reasonable accommodation is a change, exception or adjustment to a rule, policy, practice or service. For example, installing a ramp for an individual who uses a wheelchair or grab bars in the bathroom are reasonable modification would include making an exception to an existing 'no pet' rule to permit a service dog.
