INFORMATION ITEM:

Corey Hazelwood with San Carlos Little League gave a power point presentation explaining the proposal to install lights at the majors Field at lake Murray Community Park explaining that the lights would allow for the league to accommodate more Little League players from the community and ability to host more games among other benefits. He further explained that the cost is being paid through private donations and that the Little League will pay the electric bill and maintenance of the lights. Other details were provided in the presentation.

Several guests in attendance spoke in favor and not in favor of the project, asked questions, and voiced their opinions.

Guests in favor of the lights commented that it would benefit the youth and community, provide additional light and usage of the park to help in reduction of crime after dark, and help keep kids out of trouble.

Guests against the lights or having questions were: additional noise from games, practices, patrons, additional traffic and parking issues, renting to travel ball teams out of season making it a year around used field, use of field used for growth of travel ball, concern that with approval of these lights, other groups would also seek to install lights on their fields, environmental impact issues, security issues, locking gate to park/ restrooms opening and closing.

Several attendees requested that these issues be addressed, and further information provided.
