San Diego Promise Zone | Overview



About the Promise Zone

In 2016, the San Diego Promise Zone became one of 22 federally designated Promise Zones in the United States and one of only four in California. The San Diego Promise Zone covers a 6.4square-mile targeted area that spans East Village and Barrio Logan east to Encanto and is home to the City's most culturally rich and ethnically diverse neighborhoods, but also some of the most underserved communities. More than 80,000 San Diegans live in the Promise Zone, an area where unemployment is high (15.61 percent, pre-pandemic), and poverty is concentrated (39.06 percent).

Through the Promise Zone initiative, community-based organizations, direct service providers, residents, and business owners work with government agencies to streamline resources and deliver comprehensive support.

June 2023 Working Group Updates

Our working groups will not meet during June and July. We look forward to resuming meetings in August. Read below for last month's updates!

Jobs & Education heard presentations from the City of San Diego's Office of Child and Youth Success on their Master Plan as well as an update from Urban Corps on their portion of an application for the Transformative Climate Communities program which would bring \$30 Million to the City of San Diego.

Housing Affordability did not meet during the month of May. In April, the group hosted a joint meeting with the Jobs & Education working group. Both groups heard about childcare facility advocacy from San Diego for Every Child and San Diego housing developer, Chelsea Investment Corporation.

Economic Activity hosted a joint meeting with Healthy Communities. The groups identified a corridor along Imperial Avenue between 19th Street and 32nd Street for the Promise Zone Business Walk on June 28th.

Healthy Communities hosted a joint meeting with Economic Activity where the groups heard from the City's Planning Department on its recent Environmental Justice Element which will fund organizations to support community engagement activities. Then the groups heard from Circulate San Diego on its proposed roundabout projects along Imperial Avenue.
