New Street Assessment Shows Major Street Condition Improvements



As chair of the City's Infrastructure Committee, I've worked hard to ensure our streets get the level of attention and investment our residents deserve. This week we heard a new report showing all of that hard work is paying off. The new street condition assessment shows 60 percent of streets now fall into the "good category" compared to 35 percent in 2011.

This is due to a truly focused effort by Mayor Faulconer, my Council colleagues, and the City Streets Division. We passed streamlining measures, increased funding and made it easier for residents to report street damage. Watch the full press conference here.
