



Office of the City Treasurer Short-Term Residential Occupancy (STRO) Program Human Trafficking Training Resources

The STRO requirements will be in effect beginning May 1, 2023; this includes the requirement for all Hosts to maintain proof of completing a human trafficking awareness course prior to the initial listing of the dwelling unit for STRO ([San Diego Municipal Code](#), section 510.0108 (b)).

Listed below (in no particular order) are resources to assist Hosts in finding a human trafficking awareness course. Please note that the City of San Diego, Office of the City Treasurer is not endorsing the trainings/organizations included below, but rather providing this information as a courtesy to assist Hosts. Additionally, the links below are not inclusive of all human trafficking awareness courses available and Hosts may choose to complete a course that is not included.

“post, in a conspicuous location within the dwelling unit, guidance for guests to report human trafficking based on information provided by the City Manager and educate employees or contractors of the host who may interact with guests about identifying and reporting human trafficking.” [San Diego Municipal Code](#), section 510.0107 (m)
