

CONSTRUCTION NOTICE:

Towne Centre Drive Pipeline Work to Begin for the Morena Northern Pipelines and Tunnels Project

May 9, 2023

On Monday, May 15, pipeline construction will begin on southbound Towne Centre Drive south of the Executive Drive intersection as part of the Morena Northern Pipelines and Tunnels project in University City. Crews will move block-by-block on southbound Towne Centre Drive. The Towne Centre Drive and Executive Drive intersection will reopen to traffic prior to the start of pipeline work on Towne Centre Drive.

Work is scheduled to occur during the day, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. and occasionally on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Work hours in front of the Devonshire I or Devonshire II driveways are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Traffic control along Towne Centre Drive will be set up prior to construction. Crews are expected to cross the northern driveway on Tuesday, May 16, or Wednesday, May 17.

What to Expect for Devonshire Residents:

- Work in front of the Devonshire I or Devonshire II driveways will be sequenced one at a time; i.e., both driveways will not be closed at the same time. The buildings will be notified prior to work outside both the Devonshire I and Devonshire II complexes.
- While work is impacting the Devonshire I or II driveways, residents will be allowed to move vehicles out of the driveway before the work shift begins at 8 a.m. After the end of the shift and outside of work hours, residents will be able to access both driveways. Flaggers will be present to accommodate traffic.
- There will be dedicated parking for Devonshire residents along the right-of-way on Towne Centre Drive or Executive Drive. Please do not park in parking lots for neighboring businesses where parking is assigned to tenants and patrons.

What to Expect:

- The pedestrian crossings will remain open.
- Northbound Towne Centre Drive will remain open.
- For safety reasons, please follow all posted signage.
- Traffic control will accommodate access and the turning radius required for emergency vehicles.

The City is committed to clear communication and providing up-to-date information about construction activities. Properties along the construction area will receive printed notices before work begins near their address, and construction notices will be regularly posted on **utc.purewatersd.org**.
