	Consider a 30-day break in between work on Nobel and work on Genesee, as it is nighttime work on Genesee and daytime on Nobel and those houses need a break.	1-2. A 7-calendar day break has been incorporated into the specifications as Work Restriction No. 8: (Work along Genesee Avenue between Decoro Street and Nobel Drive (Night Work) shall not coincide with the work along Nobel Drive between Genesee Avenue and Towne Centre Drive (Day Work). A minimum stagger of 7-calender days is required for a work transition from Night to Day or Day to Night in this area in order to provide a temporary reprieve from construction noise for the adjacent residents.)
