San Diego Water Board Approves Permit

The votes are in and the approval is unanimous! On May 13, the San Diego Water Board adopted an order that grants a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit to the City of San Diego to add purified water to the Miramar Reservoir for Phase 1 of the Pure Water Program.

NPDES permits contain limits on what you can discharge, monitoring and reporting



requirements, and other provisions to ensure water quality and public health. San Diego's is the first NPDES permit issued for a reservoir augmentation project in the state of California.

This approval is a major milestone for the Pure Water Program and is the result of hard work by the team working on advancing a safe, reliable and sustainable water supply for San Diego. Adding the purified water to Miramar Reservoir will increase the reservoir's beneficial use and optimize protection of water quality.

By implementing Phase 1 of the Pure Water Program, the City will be able to produce and store 30 million gallons per day (mgd) of local water supplies and thus decrease the amount of water it relies on importing from hundreds of miles away.
