Halloween Safety Tips

Happy Halloween! This is one of the most anticipated holidays for both children and adults alike. Please consider the following safety tips to make Halloween a fun experience for all:

- 👤 Children should be accompanied by an adult
- 👤 Children should wear light or bright colored clothing and consider adding reflective tape to dark costumes for increased visibility
- 👤 If children wear masks, ensure that the masks properly fit and are big enough for full vision
- 👤 All candy or treats should be examined before they are consumed. Check for holes, punctures, and other evidence of tampering
- 👤 Discard any homemade or unwrapped treats
- 👤 Children should walk only on sidewalks
- 👤 Children should only cross at intersections and use crosswalks. Remember to look both directions and obey all traffic signals nearby
