The Booker family opened its doors at Fam Mart in 2012 and is known for its classy gentlemen's apparel, but what really makes them special is their commitment to giving back to our community.

DLBooker Enterprise provides free buttoned down, colored shirts and up to 50% off wardrobe needs to recently incarcerated men who have transitioned back to society. The Booker family also recognizes the hard work and dedication of high school men by providing them "GPA discounts" for their prom, school dance, or other educational ceremonies. Past students have received 50% to 70% off for their suit and accessory price. The students also receive guidance from the Booker family with one-on-one fittings, tailor services, and more.

The store also purchases many of their products from an African based company to provide monetary support for African women and children from Kenya, Ghana, Senagal, and Kilimanjaro. These items include native clothing, jewelry, home décor, as well as bath and body items.

DLBooker Enterprise is one example of the several Council District 4 businesses contributing back to our community. I commend and appreciate their dedication to give back to those who need it the most and giving residents pride in their surrounding neighborhood.
