Getting Things Done

\$22 Million Contract for Jamacha-**Lomita Improvements Approved**

On Tuesday, my Council Colleagues and I unanimously approved to authorize the mayor to award a construction contract to underground overhead utility lines in the Jamacha-Lomita neighborhoods.

The project will underground approximately 6.2 miles of overhead utility lines and convert 476 properties to underground service. In addition to the undergrounding of the utility lines, the project will also include street resurfacing and the installation of new street lights and trees. The total cost of the project is nearly \$22 million.

It will include Billow Drive, Cardiff Street, Encinitas Avenue, Sunnyside Avenue, Sawtelle Avenue, Wade Street, Dell Anne Place, and a portion of San Felipe Street (from Sawtelle Avenue to Billow Drive). In addition, there are also undergrounding projects underway along San Vicente Street and the Northern portion of Cardiff (from Jamacha Road to Wade Street).

The design is nearly complete and the City of San Diego is ready to solicit competitive bids in order to award a construction contract, a process that typically takes a few months. Construction is expected to start next year.
