What happens at the City of San Diego?



Mayor

- Directs administrative structure
- Can appoint or remove department heads
- Can approve/veto council actions
- Cannot vote on measures or ordinances, but:
- Can suggest to Council



City Attorney's Office

- An elected position
- Chief advisor to Mayor, City Council, most City Departments
- Is the City's prosecutor
- The legal representation for the City
- Defends taxpayers in lawsuits
- Protects residents & neighborhood quality of life



Council President

- Sets Council Agenda
- Presides over Council meetings
- Handles parliamentary duties
- Determines key assignments to committees



City Council

- 9 Councilmembers (1 per District)
- Establishes/modifies committees, • advisory boards, & citizen committees
- *Committees allow for smaller* groups to go in-depth on policy
- 10 active Council Committees •
- Introduces/passes ordinances or resolutions
- Affirmative vote of 5+
- Mayor can veto- veto can be overridden by affirmative vote of 6+
